RESOLUTION OF THOMAS NARCOMEY TO AUTHORIZE A COMPREHENSIVE ENROLLMENT AUDIT

WHEREAS, the Tradition of Sovereignty of the Comanche Nation, since time immemorial, which long predates the existence of the United States establishes the Inherent Sovereign Powers and Right of Comanche Self-Governance; and

WHEREAS, the Authority of the Tribal Council, as the Supreme Governing Body, is to assign and direct the Comanche Business Committee such additional duties and/or responsibilities which may be assigned to the business committee by appropriate resolution approved in tribal council assembled, pursuant to the Comanche Constitution, Article VI §7(i); and

WHEREAS, an Enrollment Audit was completed in December 2007, which removed (82) eighty-two Illegal Enrollments. This Audit covered the years 1998 to 2007, or ten years. An analysis (Attachment A) shows \$270,000 in Illegal Per Capita Payments. This figure does not include money paid for tribal services.

WHEREAS, the Comanche Constitution, Articles VI, §7(a) and §7(j), and authorizes the Comanche Business Committee to establish and maintain the tribal enrollment; to promulgate and enforce ordinances and codes governing law and order to protect the peace, health, safety and welfare of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, ten (10) years has passed since the last enrollment audit and there is an immediate need for a Comprehensive Enrollment Audit to be performed; an estimated Breakdown on Costs (Attachment B) provides for a timeline and expected costs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council authorized a comprehensive Enrollment Audit be placed on the Referendum Vote for the May 19th General Election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above Resolution was fully adopted at the Comanche Nation Annual Meeting as scheduled pursuant to the Constitution Article V §2, held on April 21st, 2018 at the Comanche Nation Complex by a majority vote of ___ for and ___ against, with a quorum present.

- 82 persons were illegally enrolled for their votes or political self-interest or favors. One person did not have any Indian blood.
- Tribal members constantly demanded an enrollment audit from 2006 to 2007 at CBC meetings to correct our enrollment. Finally, the CBC ordered our enrollment department to perform an audit in December, 2007. If concerned Comanche's did not attend CBC meetings and speak up, those illegally enrolled persons could have still been on our roll. We would have lost more than the \$269,920 plus the money paid for social services, student services, and education. We would have lost over \$ 2 million dollars.
- The \$269,920 in illegal per capita payments has not been paid back. The actual dollar amount is over one-half a million dollars when you add social services and education monies received.
- Any illegally dual enrolled minors who received per capita payments, which are held in trust by the City National Bank until they turn 18, should not receive a per capita payment when 18 because they never were constitutionally or legally enrolled. We need a CBC resolution to transfer those illegal payments back to the Comanche Nation.
- We need to enact enrollment laws to prevent enrollment fraud, fraudulent documents and application with fine and imprisonment penalties to protect our enrollment from dual or illegal enrollments and to prevent further violations. In addition, persons who receive illegal payments should pay back any money they receive.
